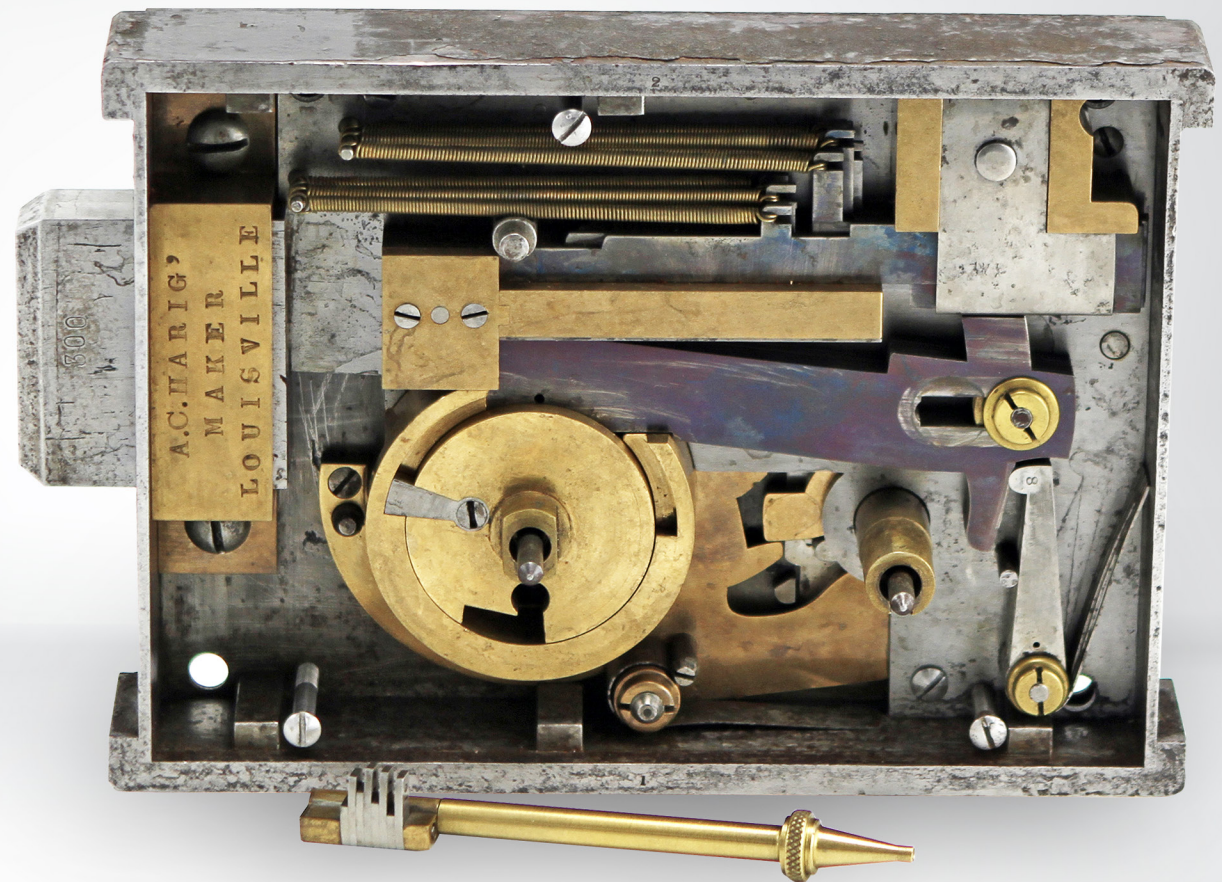


HARIG & STOY BANK LOCK

This 1854 lock was made in Louisville, Kentucky and uses a changeable-bit key with a very unusual profile.

The key bit is inserted into the lock and then the handle unscrewed, leaving the bit behind. A separate wrench (not shown) is then inserted and turned, which brings the bits against the eight levers. This wrench is then inserted into a separate hole to turn and allow the bolt to retract.

The lock can be rekeyed by rearranging the bits when the bolt is retracted.
