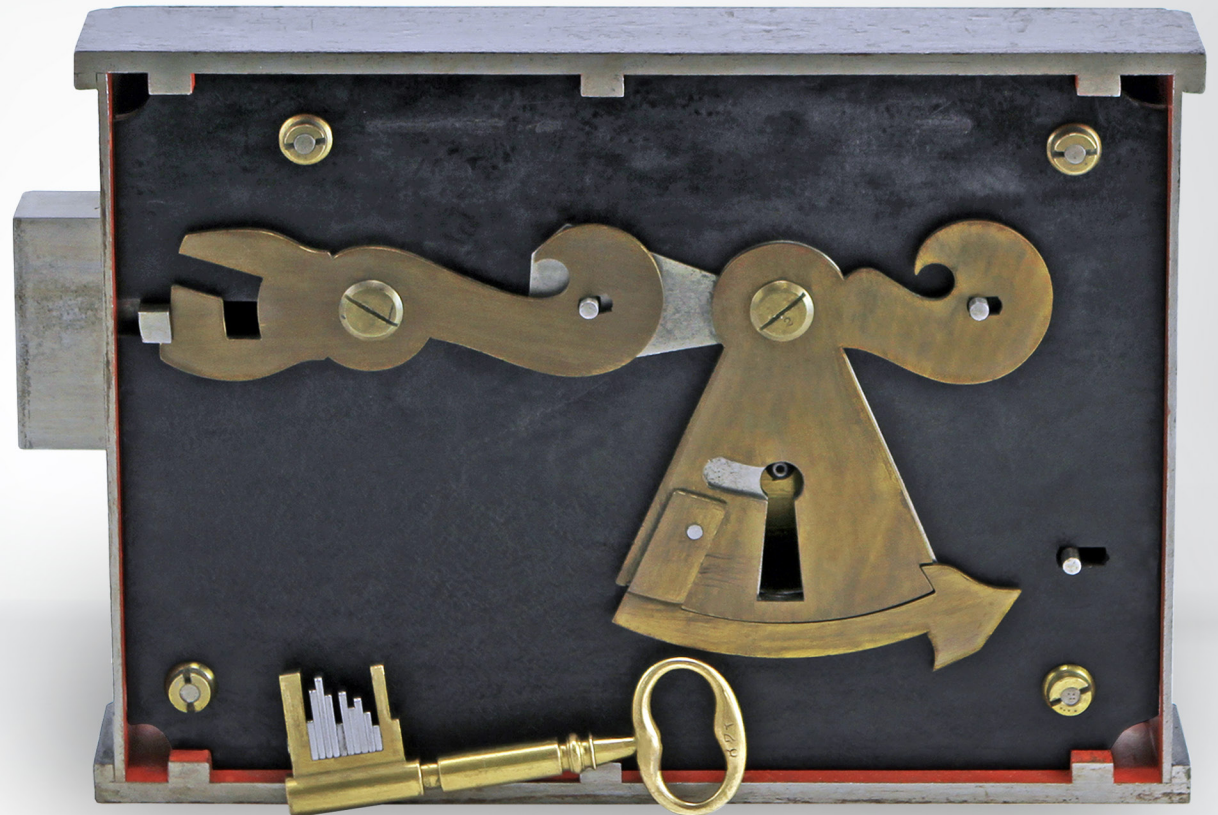


DAY & NEWELL PARAUTOPTIC BANK LOCK

Bearing patent dates of 1838-44 and June 10, 1851, this gorgeous 10 lever lock was made in New York.

Originally called "The New American Permutating Lock," it is generally referred to now by the Parautoptic name, which means "hidden from view."

This pertains to the fact that the workings of the lock are concealed from view through the keyhole once the key (or a picking tool) is inserted and turned.
